Member Share on Step Two - Kaufua

As an avid shopper, I often read all the reviews prior to making a purchase. When I came to Alcoholics Anonymous, I heard the laughter as well as the stories of hope from the numerous people that seemed genuinely happy. As far as I'm concerned, the five star reviews were all there yet I refused to buy it.

My biggest obstacle was that I didn't think I had a problem with alcohol. Warped in my insane reality, people and places were to blame for my misfortune and the world was simply out to get me. As I continued to come to the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous, I learned about **the allergy** and soon realized that perhaps I did have a problem with alcohol.

But I was resistant to working the program, again refusing to believe the five star reviews that I heard from the other members. I tried to navigate sobriety alone and as I tried to control every aspect of my life, the more unmanageable everything felt. The more I felt insane. My mind was constantly racing. I experienced emotional highs and emotional lows.

I was obsessed when people drank and counted how much they consumed, envious that it couldn't be me. I considered how I might possibly be able to manipulate and control my consumption of alcohol one day. I became miserable. Miserable enough that one day, I had the notion that I could drink and no one would even know. I panicked. Going back to step one, I understood that I was powerless over alcohol and that my life had become unmanageable due to it. "Something" inside me told me that if I drank, my life was going to spiral and there was a good possibility that I wouldn't make it back.

There was but one solution. I turned to my sponsor and to step two.

Not only had I been engulfed with insanity during my drinking, I felt it too when I had stopped drinking. I thought that if I just quit drinking, all my problems would be solved but that was not the case. I started to take a look at the things I could and could not control and became willing to believe that I wasn't as powerful as I thought I was but that there was something out there that was. Call it whatever you want; some sort of **Entity, Creator, or Realm of Spirit**. All I had to do was have faith that it existed and that it would restore me to a sane state of mind where I could experience peace and serenity. My control had only led me to failure each time. I once again saw the smiles of those in the room and heard the five star reviews once more. I humbled myself and chose to believe that if it worked for them, it could work for me. I let go of control and began working the rest of the steps with a sponsor.

To this day, I still can't name or describe my higher power but I know it as a feeling. When I am spiritually connected, I feel a sense of ease and comfort. I become less reactive and respond the way I believe my higher power would see fit. I come back to step two often for when I feel disconnected, I can easily start to take my will back. When life gets busy or the worldly clamors hit, my desire to control and manipulate things to work out in my favor resurfaces. I can easily obsess, even if not about alcohol, and begin to feel insane again. My mind can race and I can easily throw myself into self-pity as I once again believe that others are to be blamed for my "misfortune" and the world is out to get me. This could ultimately lead me back to drinking.



Thanks to sponsorship guidance and the spiritual tools that I have learned here, I don't have to let myself slip to that point so long as I remain willing and continue to take the actions. Often I'll ask myself, "do I believe that there is a power greater than me that could restore me to sanity and if so, am I willing to let go of control?" This allows me to humble myself and take a look again at my powerlessness over people, places, and things. I give it to God and take actions based on who my higher power would have me be versus what I believe I want based on my fears or selfish motives.


