Members' Views

...on STEP #2

Higher-Powered

"In the face of collapse and despair, in the face of the total failure of their human resources, they found that a new power, peace, happiness, and sense of direction flowed into them."

-- Alcoholics Anonymous, pg. 50

On the day I walked into my first A.A. meeting, I was thoroughly beaten. Every means I had tried to control my drinking had failed completely. I readily accepted the fact of my powerlessness in Step 1. The current state of my life was all the evidence I needed.

Step 2, however, presents a very different challenge: it is not a simple, fact-based proposition. Having lived my entire adult life by self-reliance and self-absorption, I was not well-equipped for a rapid shift to a reliance upon some other---hopefully more powerful---power. I approached Step 2 from a reason-based perspective, because that was the only perspective from which I could work. To begin a search for this power, I needed to ask, "Who/What, When, Where, Why and How" questions.

A.A. answers the first question by making the decision mine and mine alone, "your own conception of God." This is crucially important because I would reject having someone impose their own particular vision of a power I must accept.

A clue to "when?" was pointed out to me in the reading from Chapter 5 that is heard at most A.A. meetings, "...may you find Him now." That phrase is not just well-wishing that one's search for God will be brief: "Now" refers to living in the moment, the only place where conscious contact with the higher power is possible.

My answer to "where?" is found on page 55 of the Big Book: "We found the Great Reality deep down within us. In the last analysis it is only there that He may be found." So after looking to this and that religion, philosophy and everywhere else---Aha!

For the answer to "why?" all I really needed to do was to review the state I was in when I took Step 1, but for further clarification, see page 43: "The alcoholic at times has no effective mental defense against the first drink....His defense must come from a Higher Power."

Finally, "how?" Honesty—Open-mindedness---Willingness. I would add that a good sponsor, a well-worn Big Book kept within reach, and placing one's seat in a chair at many meetings also help.

...on TRADITION #2 Different Strokes

"It seems proved that A.A. can stand on its own feet anywhere and under any conditions. New, able, and vigorous people keep coming to the surface, turning up where they are needed. Besides, A.A. has reached enough spiritual maturity to know that its final dependence is upon God."

Bill W., personal letter, 1940

A.A. groups are entirely free to organize themselves, or not to organize themselves, as they see fit. Some groups form rotating leadership committees, elect officers and service representatives, debate every issue that arises at the district or area level, and keep abreast of all actions taken at the General Service Conference. Other groups may not even hold regular business meetings, so long as the rent gets paid and someone remembers to buy the coffee. Under A.A. tradition, each group is functioning according to their group conscience, whether by election or by inaction.

These disparate group traditions might be confusing to visiting A.A.'s, whether they are relative newcomers or old-timers. When I was new to A.A., it was suggested that I visit many different groups to see where I felt I could belong. They said it was like a drinker looking for a new bar: there are country music bars, gay bars, biker bars, upscale bars, sports bars, whatever---just find one where you feel you belong. As I have been in A.A. for some years, I do find myself frequenting some groups over others and there is one meeting I very, very seldom miss.

I don't mean to imply that the groups I have gravitated away from are doing A.A. the wrong way. They are doing A.A. their way. It doesn't matter if their way is not my way. I did used to fret about that, wondering if somehow I owed it A.A. to tell a group their traditions were not up to snuff! Tradition 2 tells me I have no business in their group conscience.

Who am I to say they are not listening to their ultimate authority?

To Accept and to Act

On a day that is especially trying for me, when gratitude is far from top-of-mind, part of me may want to rebel against doing what I really know is good for me to do---the next right thing---because it seems too hard. I might think about postponing that meeting with a sponsee; I might want to call an A.A. friend to ask if she will chair tonight's meeting in my place. When the self-pity is really *on me* like that, I just don't want to be an alcoholic today. But I am.

Days like that are one reason I feel so blessed to have been brought up in A.A. by a sponsor who gets Step 12 and who made certain that I do, too. It is a lifesaver for me. As Bill W. said in his story, "...I soon found that when all other measures failed, work with another alcoholic would save the day. It is a design for living that works in rough going."

It's true that there are no dues or fees for A.A. membership, but there are obligations. In typical A.A. fashion, these obligations are not so much onerous burdens as they are aids to spiritual growth and contented living. For me to attempt to "get by" without a commitment to regular service for others would absolutely short-change my recovery. So, just how "recovered" do I want to be? To put it another way---how can a Higher Power hold you up if you tie His arms behind His back?
