...on STEP #1

A Simple Statement of Fact

"Our admissions of personal powerlessness finally turn out to be firm bedrock upon which happy and purposeful lives may be built."

Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, p. 21

On the day I first walked into the doors of A.A., I really had no idea what to expect from you people. Would there be some kind of entrance test, an assessment of me and my drinking history? Would I qualify for membership as an alcoholic? How would I measure up to all of you folks who introduced yourselves as alcoholics?

Fortunately, I was asking the wrong questions. Step One didn't ask whether I consider myself an alcoholic, which was good since I didn't have a definition for that term. It was then---and still is now---irrelevant how I think I compare to any other alcoholic. The step simply asks if I am powerless over alcohol. It is a yes/no question. For me, that question was not difficult to answer on that day; I had left the jail a couple of hours earlier and was sitting in my first A.A. meeting, picking windshield glass out of my hair. Powerless? Unmanageable? I'd have to say yes.

Answering with a "yes", admitting powerlessness over alcohol, has proven to be the starting point for a new life for me. Saving "ves" means I belong here among you; that I want what you have and will do what you have done to get it. Saying "yes" has meant I can't just sit in the back, say nothing, and judge people.

Only Step One mentions alcohol. Sobriety is our primary concern. That doesn't mean it is our only concern, by any means; it is our first concern. The rest of the Steps help us grow to live a useful life. But it all starts with simple statement of fact: I am powerless over alcohol.

...on TRADITION #1

"Realization dawns that he is but a small part of a great whole; that no personal sacrifice is too great for preservation of the Fellowship."

Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, pg. 130

The theme of Tradition One is A.A. unity. What does unity mean to this member, this one small part of the great whole? It means that the health and strength of my group and of A.A. are dependent upon my actions just as surely as my sobriety and serenity are dependent upon my actions.

If I take my sobriety for granted, I risk losing it. If I choose self-interest ahead of what is best for the group, I weaken the group. A.A. has gained strength and flourished now for eight decades. It may seem indestructible. We take for granted that no outside forces are likely to threaten it. If A.A. is to be weakened, the damage will come from within; not in the form of a sudden upheaval, but from a multitude of little selfish pinpricks. Just as surely as a pattern of self-centered behavior threatens spiritual growth of the individual, so does the same behavior weaken A.A.'s ability to fulfill its primary purpose.

For that, I am responsible.

A.A. Service View

Never Done

"In all probability, we shall never be able to touch more than a fair fraction of the alcohol problem in all its ramifications."

Alcoholic Anonymous, Forward to the Second Edition, pg. xxi

Within an hour's drive from my home at the western end of District05, there are well over 1,000 weekly A.A. meetings; in my small town alone there are 20. The Big Book, the 12 & 12, and every A.A. pamphlet

and video are just a click away, as are meeting lists, newsletters and event calendars. I can "attend" meetings on my phone anytime, day or night. A.A. helplines are staffed by volunteers around the clock. We are awash in information. What else can possibly be left to do in service to alcoholics?

Yet, if we look up from our phones for a bit, we see that the quote above from the Big Book is every bit as true today as it was when written back in 1955. One thing that has not changed is the nature of alcoholism---cunning, baffling and powerful. Human self-will has not changed; it still dogs our every step toward spiritual growth. Fortunately for all of us, what also has not changed is A.A.'s program of recovery, unity and service: One alcoholic reaching out to another alcoholic remains the solution that works.

The challenge for service-minded A.A.'s presented by this new era of e-resources might be called "paralysis by ease of access." Why should we bother organizing local A.A. events when all that information is so neatly packaged right in our pockets? Looking back over my early A.A. experience, I can recall District-sponsored workshops and similar events that each made a very positive impression upon me. I recall a workshop on sponsorship held in a greenhouse; I don't recall exactly what was said, but I do clearly remember being impressed that this panel of experienced A.A.'s made time to share their experiences with a newcomer like me. I remember two crowded Big Book studies I attended at the Menomonie Leisure Center. The chief message I took from them was the great importance that successful A.A.'s place on a continuous program of personal education, constantly broadening and deepening their understanding of our program. In later years, having seen that District service is possible, spiritually enriching, and not actually at all abnormal, I helped organize a few other workshops which, though not that well-attended, gave me some organizing skills and introduced me to working alongside other A.A.'s toward a common goal in service of others. Clearly, each of these events was impactful by helping me come to belong in A.A. They were not slick or sophisticated or air-brushed into perfection, but they all were 100% real exercises in A.A.'s walking the talk concerning our primary purpose.

We must not allow ourselves to be lulled into service paralysis by some nebulous fear that real-world, eye-contact-with-newcomers service events can't compete for eyeballs with e-anything. We must remember that we are responsible for what we can control: our efforts and our attitudes. Outcomes are entirely out of our control, and most definitely in the hands of a power that is not me.
