again, our fair booth will happen and we will be able to add additional booths throughout the district. The committee has plans for getting printed materials in places where still suffering alcoholics will come into contact with it. Additionally, collaborating with other district and area PI committees, our committee is learning about new and exciting ways to use social media to distribute PSAs. The committee is excited to collaborate with our CPC, Cooperating with Professionals Committee, as well. The group of individuals I serve are excited and it is a privilege to be amongst them.

Of course, these projects take money and AA is fully self-supporting through our own contributions. When the committee proposed our 2021 budget in October, we were excited with our vision for 2021 and felt we had answered the call of many District 5 members who felt that the district had not been as active recently as many had hoped. So, yes, my ego was bruised and I spent too much time meditating on my "old ideas," when I and some on our committee felt threatened by a request for additional information. Isn't it amazing how our character defects can pop right up?!

The truth is we should be asked and called to question to provide the information requested. It is a spiritual action. Our committee serves at the groups! Listed below is some of the work we hope to do in 2021 with a projected cost: fair booths and possible additional booths (\$800), printing costs for distributing contact information throughout the community (\$300), Public Service Announcements, PSAs (\$300), and giving the committee chair and members the ability to participate in area events with travel costs (\$100).

While our committee understands this is a substantial increase in our budget request, we hope that our efforts, work and desire to carry the message to the still suffering alcoholic is valued by our district and supported by our groups.

We also again ask that you encourage your home group to elect a representative to become involved in our committee.


