We've all heard the admonitions that we shouldn't compare our inside to someone else's outside. The Promises give us the assurance that it is

not "extravagant" to think changes will come, sometimes quickly and sometimes slowly. Mystical thinkers of all types remind us there are a thousand paths to spiritual growth.

So what the heck is up with that creepy annual feeling that my sobriety leaves something to be desired?

This year marks not a sobriety year ending in 0 or 5, but it's in the 30s. Yet for many years, including this one, I find myself saying: "You'd think I'd be better by now."

There is a temptation to further berate myself by thinking I've failed to heed all of AA's suggestions. Rather than learn from someone talking about their step work, this annual May event causes me to think mine pales in comparison.

That then, of course, leads to me thinking I'm too self-absorbed. I still struggle with acceptance. I get annoyed and want to snarl. I still can't wait in a line in peace. Am I not entirely ready to have God remove these defects of character?

So my sobriety is either a gift of grace despite my shortcomings, or an annual reminder of the incompleteness of my program.

Aargh!

Somewhere in this tangle is the reminder that the length and quality of my sobriety is not personal. 'What the heck is up with that creepy annual feeling that my sobriety leaves something to be desired?'

Others are free to use my sobriety as a benchmark, or to ignore my approach because they are on a better path.

Listening to years of wise and sometimes not-so-wise AAs has allowed me to stay sober. I do still have the desire to not drink. I consider myself a mascot for we are not saints.

Clearly, mine is far from being a perfect program. How about yours?




